

ENTRIES, FEES AND PARKING

All entries £18.00

Late entries for all Light Horse classes will be accepted at an additional £2.00 (i.e. £20.00) both before and on the day up to one hour before published time of class.

Entries before the day close at 6pm on Friday 28th April 2023. All entries received after this will be classed as late entries.

All entries for Suffolk Horses need to have been received by the show secretary by April 1st 2023 – NO late entries (except for Young handlers)

Entry fee includes a contribution for First Aid services.

Cars accompanying competitors in lorries, park in the lorry park at their <u>own risk</u>, at a charge of £10.00 per car, payable at the gate.

Members are entitled to free entry with parking in the forward area. Disabled parking is in the forward area. General public entry is £5.00 per adult, children free with free car parking in the allotted area.

<u>CUPS and TROPHIES</u>: Cup winners are requested to enter the Grand Parade.

For reasons of security, the Woodbridge Horse Show Committee would prefer to retain all trophies and cups after presentation and will undertake the engraving as appropriate, for a small charge, payable in advance. Competitors will be able to have a photograph of themselves taken with the cup or trophy.

Rosettes to 6th place will be presented (unless otherwise stated)

HARD HATS: Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. All PAS015,VG1, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. British Showjumping helmet guidelines can be found at British Showjumping Rule 101. Classes 85 and 90 allow Adult riders only, to wear alternative riding hats entirely at their own risk.

AFFILIATIONS

Equifest qualifiers: The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant Equifest Championship class to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire 2nd–5th August 2023.

UK Ponies and Horses. 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed competitors in the appropriate classes will qualify for the Gold Medal Series at the UK Ponies and Horses Limited Spring Classic 2024. Membership of UKPH is not required to compete at the Spring Classic.

Irish Draught Horse Society (GB)

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for the qualifiers. The owners of all pure bred Irish Draught horses must be full members of the IDHS (GB). This rule does not apply to owners of Irish Draught Sport Horses. Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility.

All competing Stallions must be the progeny of a graded mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB) AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) by a Class 1 Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion and be inspected or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 OR be a Registered Irish Draught Sport Horse Stallion, and they must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over. All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

British Skewbald & Piebald Association

This show has qualifiers for the BSPA Championships September 2023. All classes will be judged within the rules and criteria of the BSPA. Copies of the Rule book and Membership / Horse Registration / Overstamping Forms can be obtained from the Show Office: 01354 638226 or may be downloaded from: www.bspaonline.com. BSPA Classes are open to Members and Non-Members but only Members will qualify for the WCC Championships.

In order to qualify, all Owners / Handlers / Riders must be Members of the BSPA and all Horses / Ponies registered with the BSPA prior to the Show. BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the Ring and signed by the Judge, otherwise the qualification is invalid.

All stallions 4 years old and over must be graded, licensed and registered with the BSPA or in possession of a 2023 Stallion Showing Permit in order to compete and must carry into the ring their Red BSPA ID Card and Stallion Bridle Discs to be worn. (Contact the BSPA for Stallion Showing Permit information).

Senior Showing and Dressage Limited (SSADL)

SSADL Home Produced Qualifiers are OPEN to both Members and Non-Members of SSADL No Spurs with the exception to senior side saddle riders, No Galloping or canter extensions, No Wearing of Face/Body Jewellery with the exception to the ear ring used by competitors with health problems. Foals are NOT permitted SSADL Classes. For In-Hand Classes- Minimum age of handler = 11 years old. First Ridden ponies/riders will be asked after the initial walk round to come into the centre of the ring. First Ridden Competitors will only canter in their individual shows. Lead Rein Riders: If a strip section is required a lead rein rider MUST stay mounted. STALLIONS- Either for In Hand or Ridden classes, Competitors Must be 16 years of age or over. Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same from qualifier to Grand Finals, unless special circumstances should arise, then it will be left to the discretion of the Directors and Advisory Committee to oversee this rule if required.

2023 Qualification System: SSADL Members will receive their own qualification card. This is to be signed in the at time of judging/presentation. This is the members responsibility to ensure the right qualifier is signed for.

- **1.** 1st to 6th in each age group will qualify for the London International Horse Show 2nd round qualifiers
- The 1st to 2nd from each AGE section will qualify for the SSADL Members Open Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted) (If a competitor has already qualified the qualification can be passed down no lower the 5th place).
- 3. The two highest placed Mountain and Moorland ponies within a class will qualify for Members Mountain and Moorland Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted)
- 4. The two highest placed Lead Rein/First Ridden ponies within a class will qualify for the **Members Lead** Rein/First Ridden Challenge.
- 5. The two highest placed Foreign Breeds animals within a class will qualify for the Members Foreign Breeds Challenge.
- 6. The winner from each class with qualify for the Senior of Year Championship
- 7. New SSADL Super Stars Championships To be eligible to compete in this championship a competitor MUS be a member of a Pony Club or Riding Club. Membership numbers required. To be put on qualification card. A competitor MUST have competed in 2 events /classes at your Pony Club or Riding Club

Once a member has filled their qualification card to the relevant classes then said card must be sent into the Office by normal post no later than the 30th August 2023. REMEBER TO PHOTOCOPY YOUR CARD.

Non – Members Qualification cards will be handed out in the ring to the two highest placed competitors in each section these are for Non-Members ONLY

Qualification cards MUST be returned to SSADL Head Office within the 10-day period of date of show along with a 2023 Membership application completed and payment made. Once a qualification card/membership is sent in correctly along with payment only **then** will Members be eligible for the Members Challenge Preliminary rounds and Challenge Finals to the held at the SSADL National Championship Show on the 9th, 10th September 2023 at Onley Grounds, Rugby, Warwickshire. This show is affiliated to the Suffolk Horse Society (SHS) and classes 1-16 are qualifiers with championship points for annually awarded trophies and for the Supreme Suffolk Horse Championship.

All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix.

All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion license number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a license is pending but not yet issued.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, and a trophy the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50.

Class 54 Unaffiliated Ridden Irish Draught 4 years and over.

This class is aimed at novice pairs, those who are <u>not</u> members of the IDHS(GB) or have <u>not</u> had their horse's passport overstamped by the IDHS (GB). However, 1st and 2nd place are eligible to come forward to Woodbridge Shows Supreme Championship today. This class is NOT a qualifier, and you are **NOT** eligible to compete in class 53.

The driver must be 8 years old or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle at all times by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years old or over, a "responsible adult". When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in the areas on the showground, all drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat that meets the latest safety regulations when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

Class 156 Exercise vehicles. Open to horses and ponies, singles, pairs and tandems. An exercise vehicle is a carriage not of traditional type of design and includes those with pneumatic tyres, specifically designed for the carriage (ie not car tyres) Lamps need not be carried.

Help and encouragement will be offered and if you don't have a dog with you, but would still like a go then please ask as we may be able to hire you a friendly dog at a little extra charge. Agility Equipment is provided courtesy of *Paws of Parham Dog Agility Club*.

Running from 10am-12pm and 1-3pm. Rosettes will be awarded at 3pm. There will be a charge for each go – all funds are going to be donated to a Charity nominated by the organisers of the dog agility classes and will be specified on the day.

LOST CHILDREN: Children who become separated from their parents or carers should be taken immediately to the Woodbridge Horse Show Secretary's office and a Woodbridge Horse Show Committee member present informed.

BYE LAWS

- All Suffolk horses must be entered under the registered name of the bona fide owner or be hired by the exhibitor. All Suffolk horses must be from Suffolk parents registered in the UK Suffolk Horse Society Stud Book. Pedigree section.
- 2. All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. All foals must be eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. Both the sire and the dam must be registered and entered in the pedigree section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion licence number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a licence is pending but not yet issued.
- 3. No stallion may be exhibited unless wearing full stallion harness. Every stallion must be safely restrained while he is on the Showground and the decision of the Show Director in the matter of the handling of stallions will be final.
- 4. Nomination entries for Suffolk Horses will not be accepted.
- 5. Prize schedules and entry forms may be obtained from the Secretary and no horse will be entered until such a form is received by the Entries Secretary and fees paid.
- 6. That fees for the entry be received the Secretary on or before 1st April 2023 as shown in this schedule and entries received after that date and on the day will be at a fee to be decided annually by the Show Committee. No late entries for Suffolk horses. Entry fees are not returnable. If, however, the Society shall refuse an entry, cancel a class or classes or the Show, entry fees may be refunded at the discretion of the Council. It may refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to refuse entries from any person who is under exclusion or suspension by any breed, livestock or show organisation. Any fees refunded shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society.

- 7. The public will be admitted to the showground at rates to be decided annually by the Show Committee. Car parking is free. Cars accompanying lorries may park in the Lorry Park at their own risk, at a cost of £10 per car, payable at the gate.
- 8. The decision of the judges is final and they will be instructed not to award a prize in classes in which the animals exhibited do not possess sufficient merit.
- 9. Servants in charge of stock shall be subject to the orders of the Show Director and Stewards of the Show.
- 10. Standing in a turnout vehicle by any person either while the vehicle is stationary or while it is being driven is not permitted on the Showground. Vehicles must be driven from either a sitting position or from the ground.
- 11. Any exhibitor shall be liable to forfeit £100 if any animal sent by him shall be labouring under an infectious or contagious disease.
- 12. In all cases of dispute a protest in writing, accompanied by a deposit of £5, shall be delivered to the Secretary before the close of the Show, otherwise the protest cannot be entertained. The Secretary shall immediately give notice of the protest to the Director and Chairman of the Show and the Stewards concerned, who shall if possible decide the case before the conclusion of the Show. Otherwise it will be referred to the Committee. In either case, the decision shall be final. The deposit of £5 shall be forfeited to the Society. When a protest is considered, all parties to the dispute shall be notified.
- 13. The Society, its Officers or Servants will not be responsible for, or accountable to, any person whatsoever for any damage or loss to the property of any person whatsoever or for any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise, or for any disease, damage or loss that may occur to any person whilst upon the Showground or car parks or whilst entering or leaving the same. The Society, its Officers or Servants shall not in any way be responsible or accountable for any accident, loss or damage that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents, or to any exhibit or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the Society's Show. Exhibitors or their servants or agents shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by them and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings, claims and costs arising therefrom. Exhibitors or their servants or agents should always be satisfied that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. Exhibitors must insure against fire and other appropriate risks not only as regards their own property but also in respect of any third party claim.
- 14. If a competitor enters two classes and times of the events clash, the competitor may claim a refund of the entry fee in respect of the class not participated in.
- 15. HARD HATS: Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. All PAS015,VG1, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted.
- 16. 'Go Pros' or other similar recording or camera devices must not be worn by exhibitors whilst on the showground and must not be mounted on either animals or equipment.
- 17. All cups and trophies for competition which are presented by or through the Woodbridge Horse Show Society are perpetual and will be held by the winner for one year only. Copies of the Rules and Regulations may be obtained from the Secretary.
