The National Pony Society (NPS)

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS **Qualifying or Life** members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from **1st – 3rd August 2023.**

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

Veteran Horse Society - AREA QUALIFIER 2023.

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2023 Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals.

Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

CLASS 1E

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on 29th September – 1st October 2023. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available midseason in 2023.

British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA)

BSPA classes are open to Skewbald and Piebail horses & ponies only.

Open to members & non-members. Members only to qualify for WCC

These classes are affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald Association and are qualifiers for the World Championships of Colour National Championship Show.

All classes will be judged within the rules and criteria of the BSPA. Copies of the rule book & membership/horse registration/overstamping forms can be obtained from the show office 01354638226 or downloaded from www.bspaonline.com

All Stallions 4 years & over must be graded, licensed and registered with BSPA in order to compete, bridal discs to be worn. In order to qualify all owners/handlers/riders must be members of the BSPA & all horses/ponies registered with BSPA prior to the show.

BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the ring & signed by the judge, otherwise qualification is invalid.

All shows held after 1st August 2023 are qualifiers for WCC 2024 Qualification 1-3 in all classes or 1-4 for classes exceeding 12

The Orsett Championship (O)

Our Showing Shows are affiliated to the Orsett Horticultural & Agricultural Show, with the championship final taking place at the Orsett Showground on 2nd September 2023. All competitors must reside in Essex or Hertfordshire to compete at this championship. The three highest placed exhibits not already qualified in each class will qualify. No membership fee is required. Qualifying cards to be collected from the show where qualified. A qualifying card for each class being entered, for the final, must be shown to the steward on entering the ring. Entry fee to be sent to the Orsett Show before the closing date 25th August 2023.

The All-England Showground, Hickstead Thursday 14th – Sunday 17th September 2023

Our June Show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All-England Showground, Hickstead from Thursday 14th – Sunday 17th September 2023. The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Show Jumping from Lead Rein to 1.05m; Showing for lead rein, in-hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more, Eventer's Challenge from 50cm through to 90cm.

Qualification: Dressage & Show Jumping 1st – 3rd place; Showing & Eventer's Challenge 1st – 4th place. Qualification does not pass down the line.

The Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA)

TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes Affiliation Number TGCA 23/1106/2/ULT

No known breeding required to enter these classes

TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is bred traditional gypsy cob. Stallions – All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.


Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.

Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification.

The British Appaloosa Association (BApS)

British Appaloosa Society Card of Merit will be awarded to the highest placed BApS member with a BApS registered horse (including part-breds) in classes 3, 12, 36 & 37 (June) 5, 6, 22 & 24 (August) BApS Membership cards must be shown in the ring to claim your award and the card of Merit must be signed by the Judge or Show secretary. It is the members responsibility to return the Merit card to BApS to claim their award following the show.

The XC must be completed within 20 minutes of your Showjumping. The XC will be a mixture of working hunter/rustic and small XC fences. Approximately 8 jumps in each round. Numbers must be clearly visible at all times.

- Class 26 Intro B, not exceeding 45cm jumping. Not exceeding 45cm working hunter, rustic fences. This class is for novice combinations and not to have won at prelim level or at 45cm or above. This class can be entered on lead rein, open to seniors and juniors



Please adhere to our rules & take note of any posters displayed on the day.

Thank you

- Rosettes are awarded up to sixth place. Special rosettes are given out at the judges' discretion.
- Classes will be limited to 16 competitors. If any classes become full before the show day, it will be posted on our Facebook page.
- Entry fees will only be refunded if the event is cancelled.
- Riding hats must be worn when mounted.
- Walk only is permitted on the show ground apart from designated warm up areas.
- No horse/pony is to be left unattended whilst tied to the lorry/trailer.
- Tiptree & Thurstable Riding Club, judges and helpers cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss to belongings or persons on the show ground.
- We cannot be held responsible for the safety of any horses, riders or visitors on the show ground.
- Please ensure you have adequate insurance for yourself and your horse.
- All dogs are to be kept on lead at all times. Any foulings are to be picked up and disposed
 of appropriately.
- Horses and ponies must be vaccinated.
- Please place all rubbish in the bins provided, and pick up all loose droppings before you leave.
- We reserve the right to cancel the event due to unsuitable weather. Should a show be
 cancelled, the decision will be made the day before. You will be contacted by email or social
 media to arrange a refund.
- Horses and ponies must be over 4 years of age in all ridden classes.
- Excessive use of whips will not be tolerated.
- The committee reserves the right to refuse entry and/or to remove any animal/competitor without being liable for compensation.
- Start times are only approximate.
- The judges' decision is final. Any complaints must be made in writing within 24 hours of the show day with a £20 fee. The committee will then discuss the outcome after the show date.
- Lead rein entrants must have the lead rein attached to the noseband only. Snaffle bridles only.
- No stallion/colt is allowed in young handler classes. Stallions/colts must be handled by over 14 year olds. Stallions/colts must be bitted. Stallions/colts must be declared on arrival and parked accordingly.
- Be respectful of other competitors in the warm up; pass left to left; do not stop on the track or at gateways.
- PLEASE NOTE THAT THERE IS NO WATER AVAILABLE ON THE SHOWGROUND
- It is the responsibility of the rider to keep track of classes and times, classes will not be held or refunded if times clash.
- No lead rein in any classes unless stated.
- It is a condition of entry that all competitors agree to the rules set out above & in the schedule. Payment of entry fee shall be deemed as acceptance of these conditions.
